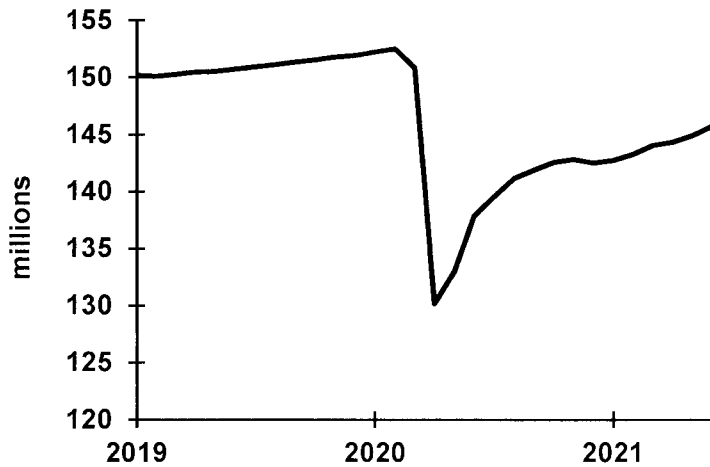
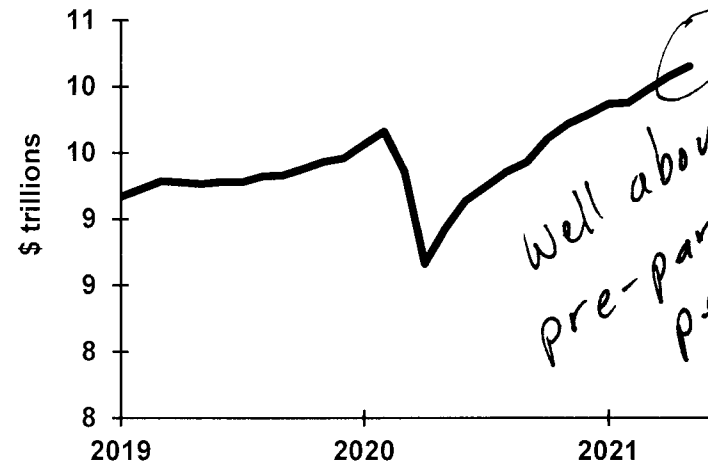

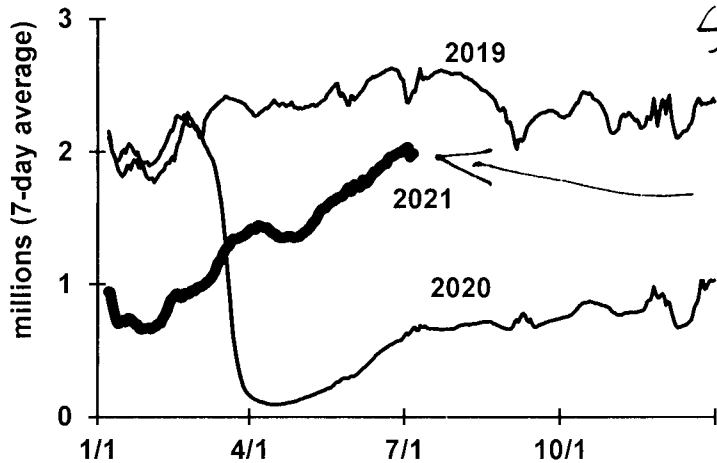

Airline Passengers (TSA throughput)

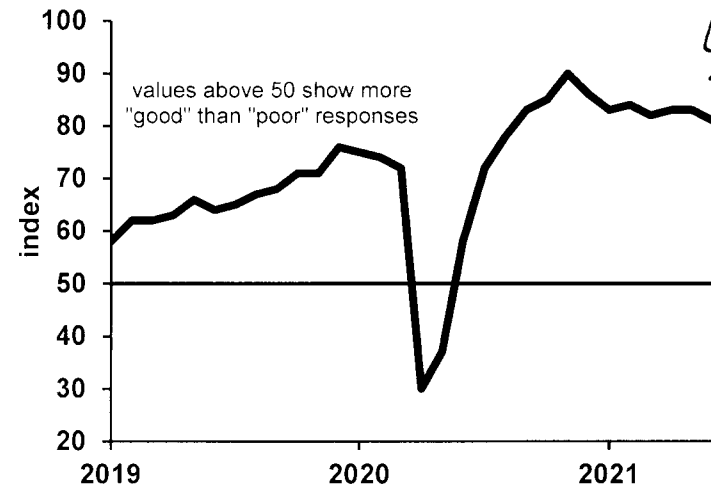

Housing Market Index

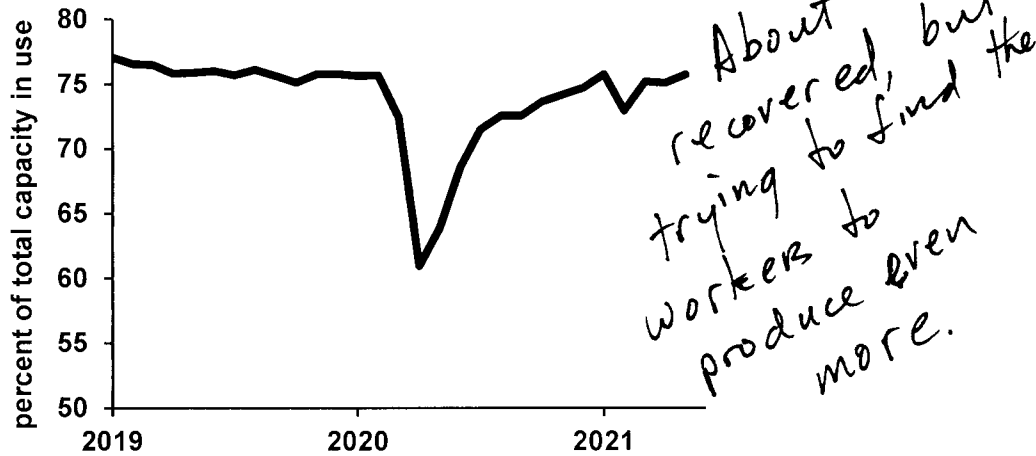

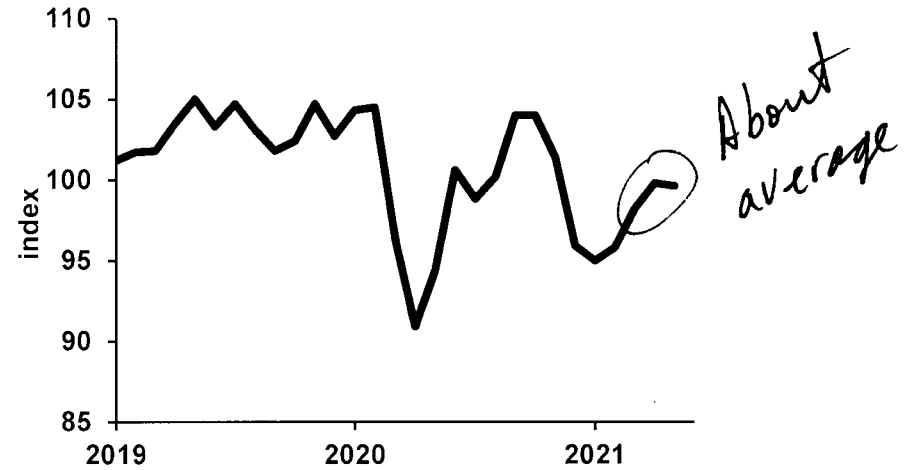
